Then the ship stopped moving up and down with the ocean current. There were no more waves crashing into the side. The feeling of movement was replaced by an odd stillness.


Wherever we were going, we were there. We had found land.


We stood in silence. Every now and then, someone would whisper, "What's going on?" Within seconds, someone else would answer, "I don't know."


